Dear FWOC Club President:

I am happy to enclose your copy of the Resolutions passed at the 6th Annual Convention of the Federation of Western Outdoor Clubs, held this year at the Mazama Lodge, Mt. Hood, Oregon. We hope that you and your members find them to be useful guides regarding the serious conservation issues that we will all have to deal with in the coming 12 months. And, if you or anyone in your membership has any questions about any one of them, please do not hesitate to contact me at any time.

As always, the Resolutions are not intended to bind any Member Club to the specific policies enunciated therein. Although each one was thoroughly reviewed and discussed at the Convention before passage (usually unanimously, after debates and amendments), they represent only the official policy of the FWOC itself. Individual member Clubs may have different policies, and as always, are free to arrive at their own conclusions on any issue.

I want to report to you several other new and exciting developments that came from this year's Annual Convention. First, the delegates approved several significant changes in our governing FWOC Bylaws. Their main thrust is to increase the flexibility of our internal operating structure, e.g., so that the FWOC Executive Committee can more readily adjust dues payments and accept new member clubs. Please let me know if you would like your own copy of these Revised Bylaws for your records.

Second, we have decided to increase the FWOC's ability to raise operating money so that we can better serve our Members. Right now, most of the income we receive from your dues (and a few other sources) goes into the
