Finally, the Resolutions are not intended to bind any Member Club to the policies mentioned therein. Although each one was thoroughly discussed and discussed at the Convention before passage (usually after debate and amendments), they represent only the official position of the FWOC itself. Individual member Clubs may have different policies and as always, are free to arrive at their own conclusions on any issue.

I would like to report to you several other new and exciting developments that arose at our 66th Annual Convention. First, the delegates approved several changes to our governing FWOC Bylaws. Their main thrust is to increase the flexibility of our internal operating structure, e.g., so that the Executive Committee can more readily adjust dues payments and membership numbers. Please let me know if you would like your own copy of the Revised Bylaws for your records.

Second, we have decided to increase the FWOC's ability to raise operating funds so that we can better serve our Members. Right now, most of the income we receive from your dues (and a few other sources) goes into the
